Update on COVID-19 processes at CSA Mine

Glencore's CSA Mine has introduced additional health screening of its workforce to minimise the risk of COVID-19 infection.

The screening applies daily on entry to site. All employees and contractors must pass a health screen, including a temperature check and answer questions on their health, recent travel history, and any contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case.

The non-contact temperature testing will be conducted safely, by authorised personnel, in line with social distancing requirements.

Glencore has enacted a range of measures across its operations, including social distancing systems and protocols, regular communications with our workforce on the importance of good hygiene and health, increased cleaning and sanitisation of workplaces, and the development and implementation of a Communicable Diseases Plan.

We have restricted all non-essential travel and strongly recommended our people postpone or cancel non-essential personal travel. We have also developed self-quarantine and isolation procedures in the event of a suspected or positive case at any site.

We recognise that the fast moving situation is concerning for our communities and workforce, and we are doing all we can to prevent and minimise the spread of COVID 19.

The Australian Government has identified mining as an essential service and by continuing to operate safely and responsibly, we will help sustain the economy at a critical time while making a vital contribution to our regional communities.
