Community Partnership Panel Meeting Summary

Site: Freeport-McMoRan Safford Operations

Date: September 12, 2018

Purpose

The <u>Community Partnership Panel</u> is hosted by Freeport-McMoRan to keep the community informed about operational activities and to foster open and ongoing dialogue to develop thoughtful solutions to address community issues.

<u>Safford operations</u> continues mine development at Lone Star, with activities occurring 24 hours a day and three production shovels in place as of September 2018. Afourth shovel is expected by end of year. Hiring is ongoing with nearly all 300 additional positions filled. Employment at Safford operations will sustain at 1,000 as Lone Star is developed from 2018 through 2020.

Approximately 300 contractors will support various activities in different phases throughout the project, including upgrades to some existing infrastructure and construction of a new leach pad, which is underway. In the second quarter, a daily average of 155 contractors were on site. Recent construction activities on the Lone Star leach pad are occurring 24 hours a day and, as a result, residents may notice lights around the construction area overnight. This will continue through the end of 2018.

Current Safford mine employment in Graham County has increased to 1,000 employees, with 215 at the Central Analytical Services Center and Technology Center at Sanchez.

The Morenci mine in Greenlee County employs more than 3,500 people and had a daily average of 1,300 contractors supporting operations and strategic projects at the site.

Attendees received an overview of FM Safford's water management program to provide insight about how the site manages water both at the mine and at our offsite properties in an effort to mitigate any effects from water consumption for mining activities as well as to offset any decreased flows to the Gila River associated with our zero discharge strategy at the mine site.

The company commissioned the L. William Seidman Research Institute at Arizona State University to develop annual <u>Economic Impact Reports</u> for the company's operations in Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico and Texas.

The combined direct and indirect economic impact of the Morenci and Safford operations on Graham and Greenlee counties was approximately \$423 million and the combined impact to the State of Arizona was \$1.1 billion. Employment at the end of 2017 was nearly 3,300 at Morenci and 740 at Safford, with a total impact of more than 10,830 jobs on Arizona's economy.

For the third consecutive year, Freeport-McMoRan has received the top honor for the Materials Sector by the Civic 50. This is the sixth consecutive year the company has been recognized as a leader for the sector. The Civic 50 has provided a national standard for superior corporate citizenship since 2011 and showcases how companies can use their time, skills and other resources to improve the quality of life in the communities they do business.

Freeport-McMoRan Foundation Investments – Grant Opportunities / Social Investing

<u>Mini-Grants for Education</u> – designed to support K-12 teachers and schools in Freeport-McMoRan communities. Eligible programs range from field trips to literacy efforts to incentives for student performance. Deadline to apply: Oct. 1, 2018.

<u>Women's Development Grant Program</u> – established with the goal of supporting programs and projects that focus on providing women and/or girls opportunities to reach their full potential and achieve economic success. Deadline to apply: Oct. 1, 2018.

<u>Graham County Community Investment Fund</u> – Freeport-McMoRan is proud to engage leaders in Graham County to cultivate and assess community projects that address community priorities. Three grants were made this summer:

- Graham County Rehabilitation Center's Facility Accessibility project for \$35,000
- Safford Downtown Association's Safford Theatre project for \$150,000
- The Gila Watershed Partnership's effort in *Building the Capacity of the Gila Native Plant Nursery* for \$60,500

A fund balance of \$154,000 is available for grants before Dec. 31, 2018, through an RFP process seeking proposals that address the priority area of Economic Development and the specific community outcomes of:

- Business diversification, support and attraction
- Improvements in community infrastructure

Letters of Interest were due by Sept.14, 2018, and the process will conclude on Dec. 1, 2018.
