Integra Underground Operation

Glencore and Bloomfield signed agreements in August 2015 to acquire 100% of the Integra coal mine complex from Vale S.A. and its five joint venture partners.

Glencore acquired the Integra underground operations, while Bloomfield took ownership of the Integra open cut mine together with the wash plant and rail loop facilities.

Glencore has a commercial agreement to utilise the wash plant and rail loop facilities.

Integra Underground is 100% Glencore owned.

- The EMS covers design, development, production, maintenance and rehabilitation of the operation and its infrastructure.
- The EMS framework provides comprehensive standards, procedures, objectives and targets to help maintain and continually improve our environmental performance.
- To evaluate the effectiveness of our environmental management process we conduct monitoring of meteorological conditions, air quality, water quality, noise levels, subsidence effects, heritage sites, flora and fauna and rehabilitation areas.

Integra Underground Achievements

- Development of longwall 14 recommenced in February 2017 under Glencore ownership.
- A new 3.8 kilometre, steel cord drift belt was installed in April 2017.
- Longwall mining recommenced in June 2017.
- First shipment of Integra Underground coal was railed in June 2017.



1999

Integra Underground, formally known as Glennies Creek Colliery was established.

2014

The underground operations were placed on care and maintenance at the completion of Longwall 12.

2016

Glencore announced plans to re-start mining at Integra Underground, including Longwalls 13 and 14.

2018

Glencore announces plans to extract an additional 5 Longwall blocks to Longwall 20.

2002

First longwall mining commenced in the Middle Liddell seam.

2015

Glencore acquired the assets of the underground from Vale S.A. and its five joint venture partners. The mine remained on care and maintenance.

2017

Coal mining recommenced with the extraction of Longwall 13 and development of Longwall 14. Glencore announces plans to mine an additional longwall – Longwall 15.

2020

Glencore progresses mining into Longwall 16 and confirms mining will cease at the completion of Longwall 18.
