OBUASI Ghana



On receipt of the requisite approvals from the Government of Ghana, the Obuasi redevelopment project began in early 2019. This followed the mine's having been place on care and maintenance in 2016.

To date, phases 1 and 2 of the redevelopment project have been completed, bringing capacity to 4,000tpd by mid-2022. Phase 3, which is currently underway, will increase capacity to 5,000tpd and is scheduled for completion by end 2023.

Obuasi is one of two AngloGold Ashanti operations in Ghana, and one of five in Africa.
